RECOMMENDATIONS

1 Choose the right windows and doors:
Check for the EnergyStar rating when purchasing new windows or doors.

2 Use LED lights:
Your old style light bulbs are wasting money. Replace them with low-cost and long-lasting LED bulbs.

3 Prep for each season:
Take the following steps to keep your home warm in the winter and cool in the summer:

- Make sure your inside air doesn't escape outside by sealing all exterior openings (e.g., doors and windows)
- Keep your home a constant temperature by insulating your attic.

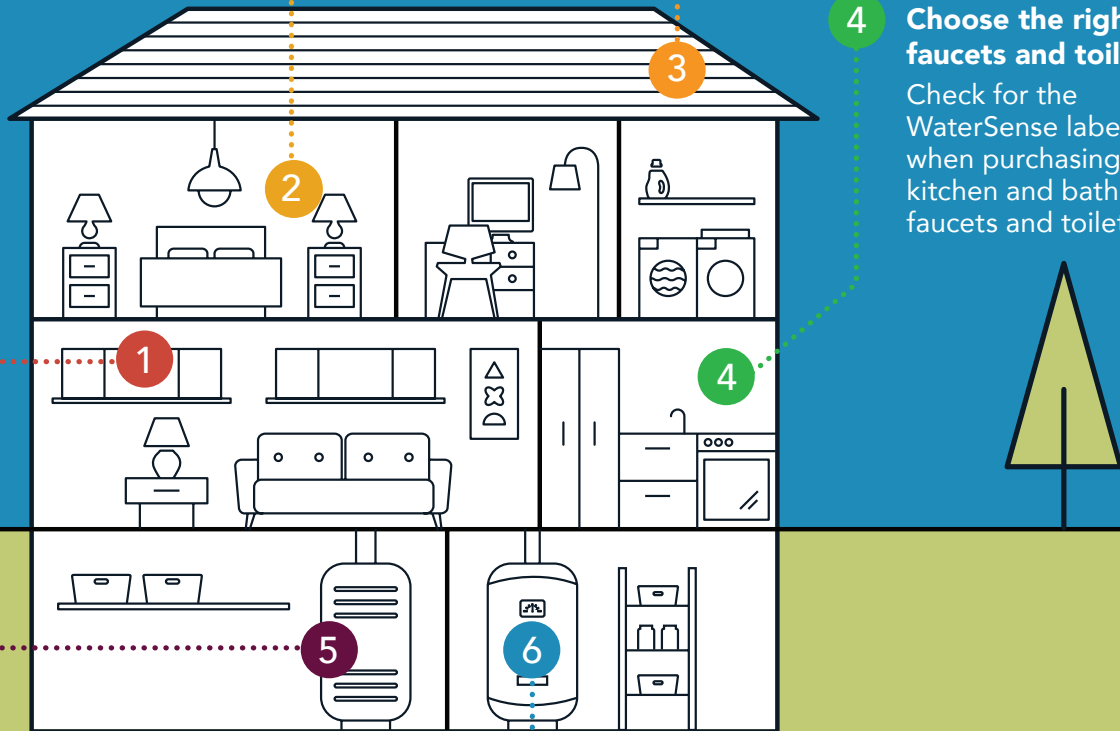
4 Choose the right faucets and toilets:
Check for the WaterSense label when purchasing new kitchen and bathroom faucets and toilets.

5 Check your water heater:
If your heater is more the 10 years old it may be time to replace it with an EnergyStar rated model

6 Service your heating and cooling systems:
Keep your home comfortable and the costs low:

- Make sure your new furnace, boiler or central air systems is EnergyStar rated. Access rebates for efficient equipment from PECO and PGW.
- Replace your old manual thermostat with a programmable or smart thermostat
- Seal and insulate ductwork in your basement and attic to get the most out of your heating and cooling system
