Organizational Updates

- FY24 Budget Approval
- Hiring Plan
 - Open now: Workforce Development Coordinator
 - Next up: Finance Director, IRA Manager, Program Coordinator (Built to Last), Grants Coordinator (Operations team) and Good Jobs Challenge Director
 - Last in: Communications Manager
- Summer interns!

City Budget

- PEA received a \$1.05MM increase over FY23 budget
 - Total FY24 budget from City = \$2.05MM
 - Raised additional \$6MM+ from various sources
- OOS received an increase of \$1.1MM
- Streets received \$5MM to support Future Track job training program
 - Performing alleyway clearing for streetlighting project



Inflation Reduction Act

- Hired technical consultant to maximize impact of IRA in Philadelphia
 - Sustainable Capital Advisors MBE financial advisory and consulting firm based in D.C.
- Solar for All / Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund
 - Focus on LMI solar, community solar
 - PEA and PGCC working with DEP and PEDA on PA-wide application due September 26
 - Applying as large-sized program (\$250MM-400MM, greater than 30K households served)
 - Sharing Philly program models statewide

Inflation Reduction Act

- Climate Pollution Reduction Grant
 - DVRPC received for \$1MM for regional planning
 - Multi-state planning and implementation of GHG reducing measures
 - Another round of funding available for implementation following the planning period
 - PEA and PGCC on steering committee and vendor selection committee
- Building America Retrofit Field Validation and Demonstration
 - PEA submitted application in partnership with Penn State University
 - To support data analysis of individual measures and whole-home energy performance in Built to Last program
 - \$1-\$3MM award potential

Inflation Reduction Act / BIL

- Renew America's Nonprofits
 - PGCC and PEA joining onto 1-3 partner apps to help identify and connect local subrecipients to funding
 - Up to \$200K for nonprofit organizations to pursue energy efficiency retrofits
 - Application due August 3, awards announced October 6
- Buildings UP
 - PEA submitting application with BlocPower, Penn State and Hunting Park NAC/CRC
 - To support nonprofits, houses of worship and small businesses reduce their energy costs through energy efficiency projects, on-site renewable energy generation and overall decarbonization of their buildings
 - Due July 18

PUC Commissioner Zerfuss Visit (5/11/2023)

- Visited ECA to learn about GRIT cohort and clean energy workforce development opportunities
 - Included sneak peek of heat pump training lab



Philly Streetlight Improvement Project

\$91.2MM project

- 130K fixtures reached (replacement and/ or connection to lighting management system) citywide
- 50% energy use savings
- No fixtures cut from scope energy / O&M savings / rebates offset debt services in this budget neutral project
- Bond issuance on August 1
 - PEA's first issuance
 - On track to be City's first sustainable bond (green + social benefit)
- Construction kickoff on August 8 at Shepard Recreation Center (pictured)
 - Starting with majors and residential post-tops
 - Prioritizing "boosted" locations





Adams Solar

- Project on track to meet target
 COD December 2023
- Civil construction complete
- Panels laid on east side
- On-the-job training opportunities for PEA workforce development program participants slated for Summer 2023
 - Training on mechanical and/or electrical work, depending on areas of interest of participants

Municipal Projects

Releasing two RFPs for municipal energy projects this summer

- Quadplex+ GESA
 - 14 buildings including City Hall, MSB, One Parkway and Health Centers
- 2. Renewables for the City PPA (next Adams Solar)
 - Up to 490,000 MWh annual energy production from multiple sites = 3.5x Adams Solar
 - Would cover up to 75% of CoP municipal energy use

PNE Solar re-procurement/RFP to follow



Phase 5+6 (Sept 2021-Dec 2022)



- Introduced a solar lease option with PosiGen, no up-front cost, 3rd party maintenance and tax credits
- LMI projects have some subsidy through SREC purchases
- Launched Commercial Solarize w/ Solar States and EDPR (which includes new PPA option)
 - 66 commercial projects in pipeline







Construction Spending



American Water Resources Partnership

- 85K customers in flagship Water and Sewer Line Protection Program
- 25K+ enrolled in new protection products
- \$55MM+ saved in repair costs for consumers
- 74% of claims to date serviced by M/W/DBE contractors
- 5% of all claims had an NOD from PWD
 majority of infrastructure repairs are self-identified
- 5,500/month calls handled, 92% Customer Satisfaction

- # of Students: 30
- 4-Week Summer Enrichment Program running July 10-August 4, 2023

Bright Solar Futures Program (OppY)

Partnership w/ PowerCorpsPHL

- Cohort 4: January 17, 2023
- 13 weeks of training + 6-week internships
- 10 participants started
- 8 completed
- 2 placed into full time employment
- 6 completed paid internship receiving placement assistance

Total Results so far:

- 4 Cohorts: 57 participants enrolled, 36 Completed (63%)
- 32 Students were placed into paid internships (88%)
- 21 NABCEP Associates Certifications, 19 OSHA-30s
- 25 Placements to date (Jobs/Apprenticeships) (78%)





Green Retrofit Immersive Training (GRIT)

Key Stats:

- 18-week Green Residential Construction Program, includes 6-week field internship
- 3 Cohorts launched, 33 participants completed
- 25 completed Internships
- 80% placed into jobs, post-internship completion
- Average Wage: \$18.76 per hr
- Ongoing placement and follow-up services through December 2023
- 3rd cohort launched April 2023
- Funded by the EDA thru Good Jobs Challenge and other funders











C-PACE Program

- Closed third multifamily project in Q4
- \$456,000 C-PACE fees earned in FY23
- 4 projects in FY 23 (\$89MM)
- 14 projects closed since July 2020 (\$158MM)

- FY24 Budget projects positive year-end cash balance driven primarily by 280% increase in awarded funds
- IRA Consultant selected with PEA: Sustainable Capital Advisors
- Built to Last contracts for Phase 2 and beyond:
 - Habitat for Humanity Construction Management Contract
 - PHDC Whole Home Repair Contract



Fundraising Update

- ✓ Secured: \$250K subgrant from William Penn Foundation
 - To support PGCC staff time, consulting engagement, and grant writing for GGRF applications and other IRA opportunities
 - Two year grant
- ✓ Secured: \$842K grant from Green Family Foundation
 - \$690K for LMI solar support in the Built to Last and Solarize programs (3 yr time horizon)
 - \$152K of flexible funding for operations and capacity building (1 yr grant)
