
- Contracting ordinance <u>Bill 250103</u>
 introduced in Council on Feb 13
 - Referred to Finance Committee where it's awaiting a hearing
- Investment Grade Audit underway to refine scope and cost
- <u>Up next:</u> Board approval and introduction of financing ordinance



- Utility-scale renewables PPA
 - Finalist negotiations underway
 - <u>Up next</u>: Issue notice of award, board approval and introduction of contracting ordinance



- PWD Wastewater Treatment Plants GESA
 - RFP opened on Jan 10, 2025
 - Proposals received on Apr 11 and review underway
 - <u>Up next:</u> Interviews expected in May & vendor selection in June, assessment of RISE PA eligibility



- Philly Streetlight Improvement Project
 - 80% installed, 105,000+ fixtures
 - University of Pennsylvania's Crime and Justice Policy Lab Study released
 - 21% decrease in gun crimes where new lights were installed
 - 16% decrease in property crime, 20% decrease in violent crimes
 - <u>Up next:</u> TOMORROW press event on study's findings with City officials

Grants - Green & Healthy Homes Initiative: Thriving Communities

- Awarded \$349K to support GRIT program for Cohorts 7 and 8 (Fall '25, Spring '26) over two years
- Funds staff capacity, participant stipends, transit passes and GRIT graduate engagement

Partnership News:

PCA's- HUD *Older Adult Home Modification Program*- first project recently completed under this grant (multi-year grant that will serve ~200 BTL homes)

Process Update:

BTL's waitlist is integrating with the City's *One Philly Front Door* system. Soft launch last week of April. PEA will update our site in the coming weeks.


Exciting Stats:

Emerging from deep-energy-retrofit projects, home energy modeling projects that some homes will see:

- Up to 89% reduction in site energy usage
- Site carbon emissions reduced as much as 72%
- Homes saving as much as \$1,200 annually






Evaluation from Deep Energy Retrofit Projects

American Water Resources Partnership

- 86K customers and 119K plans in 2024
- \$78.8MM+ saved in repair costs for consumers
- 76% of claims to date serviced by M/W/DBE contractors
- 3% of all claims had an NOD from PWD majority of infrastructure repairs are selfidentified
- 3,020/month calls handled, 96% Customer Satisfaction

- School District of Philadelphia & PEA collaborated to locate new school for BSF CTE program
- Randolph has been selected as a viable option
 - Currently interviewing for new teacher prospects
 - BSF CTE Solar Program tentatively scheduled to begin at Randolph in Fall of 2025



Green Retrofit Construction Immersive Training (GRIT)

GRIT 2025

- Two Cohorts in 2025
 - Dates for cohort 6: March 10, 2025 July 1, 2025
 - Dates for cohort 7: June 2, 2025 October 3, 2025
 - Cohort 7 recruitment will begin the last week of April

Program Updates

- One day orientation moving forward
- New soft skills partner currently working with cohorts
- Intern, Niya Manning, assisting with Cohort 6 & 7 until June. A new Summer intern will be starting mid-June to assist Workforce and programming

PEA Sponsored Trainings for 2025

 In collaboration with PhilaPOSH, PEA will be sponsoring an OSHA-30 training in May



- Sponsoring forklift training with a new partner in May/ June
- The intention is to provide a pathway to employment to those who may have not been selected for our programs, upskill those who are already employed
- Trainees who complete the OSHA and forklift trainings receive employment support from PEA

Employment

- No cost extension of GJC to September 2026
- All placement data has been resubmitted to ensure all placements have been accurately accounted for
- Engaged with new employers contacts at the Clean Energy Lunch & Learn on April 9, 2025
- Expecting placements to increase in the coming quarters!


C-PACE Program

- Commercial real estate still extremely sluggish and likely to stay same or get worse




C-PACE by the numbers

Program Fees by Fiscal Year through 3/31/25








C-PACE Pipeline Update
